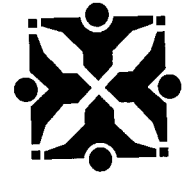

Executive Summary

Amending Chapter 14 of the City Code of Ordinances to convert ten (10), two-hour parking meters to ten-hour meters on portions of Sixth Street, Seventh Street and Cherry Street.

Discussion

CenturyLink has requested that the City convert ten (10), two-hour parking meters to ten-hour meters, to allow for extended parking of their utility vehicles while performing duties within the Network Operations Center, located just north of Cherry Street, between Sixth and Seventh streets. All of the requested spaces are adjacent to their building, and staff supports this request.

CenturyLink has also requested that the City designate at least one parking space on each city block, for utility vehicle parking only, to allow utility employees to perform the necessary functions of their job within a customer's location. City staff is currently evaluating this request, and working toward developing a pilot program.

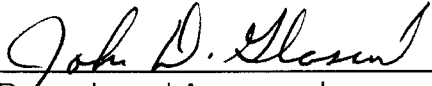

AN ORDINANCE

amending Chapter 14 of the City Code to establish 10-hour parking zones on portions of Cherry Street, Sixth Street and Seventh Street; and fixing the time when this ordinance shall become effective.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 14 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Columbia, Missouri, is hereby amended as follows:

Sec. 14-414. Ten-hour zones.

No person shall, during the hours set forth in this division, park a vehicle in any parking space on the following designated streets or off-street parking lots alongside of, next to, in front of, or behind which a ten-hour parking meter is installed, for a longer period of time than ten (10) hours at the rate established in section 14-413:

...

Ash Street, north side, from a point one hundred and fifty feet (150) west of College Avenue to St. Joseph Street.

Cherry Street, north side, from Sixth Street thence east sixty-seven (67) feet.

Locust Street, north side, between one hundred twenty (120) feet west of the west curbline of Waugh Street and College Avenue.

...

Second Street, both sides, from Broadway to Walnut.

Sixth Street, east side, from a point sixty (60) feet north of Cherry Street to a point one hundred forty-five (145) feet north of Cherry Street.

Seventh Street, west side, from a point sixty (60) feet north of Cherry Street to a point one hundred forty-five (145) feet north of Cherry Street.

...

Sec. 14-416. Two-hour zones.

No person shall, during the hours set forth in this division, park a vehicle in any parking space on the following designated streets or off-street parking lots, alongside of, next to, in front of, or behind which a parking meter is installed, for a longer period of time than two (2) hours at the rate established in section 14-413, except for a mobile food vendor with a meter bag issued by the public works department:

~~Cherry Street, both south sides, between Fourth Street and Hitt Street.~~

Cherry Street, north side, between Fourth Street and Sixth Street.

Cherry Street, north side, from a point sixty-seven (67) feet east of Sixth Street to a point one hundred twelve (112) feet east of Sixth Street.

Cherry Street, north side, from Seventh Street to Hitt Street

Locust Street, both sides, between Eighth Street and Tenth Streets.

...

~~Sixth Street, both sides, between Ash Street and Elm Street.~~

Sixth Street, east side, between Ash Street and a point one hundred forty-five (145) feet north of Cherry Street.

Sixth Street, east side, from a point sixty (60) feet north of Cherry Street to Elm Street.

Sixth Street, west side, between Ash Street and Elm Street.

~~Seventh Street, both east sides, between Walnut Street and Locust Street.~~

Seventh Street, east side, from Broadway north to the alley north of Broadway.

Seventh Street, west side, between Walnut Street and a point one hundred forty-five (145) feet north of Cherry Street.

Seventh Street, west side, from a point sixty (60) feet north of Cherry Street to Locust Street.

Eighth Street, both sides, between Walnut Street and Elm Street.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

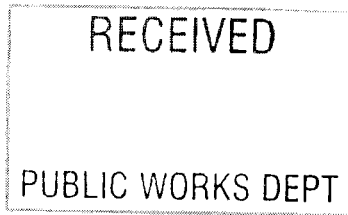

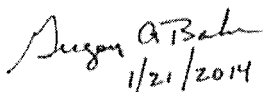

CenturyLink requests the City of Columbia to convert the following parking meters adjacent to the CenturyLink office to allow parking for up to 10 hours. CenturyLink requests two of these meters on each street have a designation for Utility Vehicle parking. This allows CenturyLink vehicles which do not fit in a parking garage to remain on a city block for as long as needed for the employee to perform their duties within the network operations center.

CenturyLink encourages the city to designate one parking space at minimum on each city block for Utility Vehicle parking. This allows the utility employee to perform the necessary functions of their job within a customer's location, especially in urgent situations such as an outage, without the concern of reserving a space or facing fines for parking on a city block for an extended length of time.
