BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBIA, MISSOURI, AS
FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute an agreement with
the Central Missouri Humane Society for animal control services. The form and content of
the agreement shall be substantially as set forth in "Exhibit A" attached hereto and made a
part hereof as fully as if set forth herein verbatim.

**2012 CONTRACT FOR SERVICES, between
City of Columbia and Central Missouri Humane Society**

WITNESSETH:

For and in consideration of the covenants and agreements contained herein, the City of Columbia, Missouri and the Central Missouri Humane Society, agree as follows:

I. Definitions:

For the purpose of this contract, the following definitions shall apply:

1. Animal Control (AC) is the office of Animal Control within the city of Columbia's Department of Public Health and Human Services and shall refer to the department and its employees.
2. CMHS is the Central Missouri Humane Society, a Missouri not-for-profit corporation (CMHS).
3. City is the City of Columbia, Missouri, a municipal corporation (City). Items ascribed to City may include some whose cost is shared by City and Boone County.
4. Holidays as used in this contract shall be New Year's Day, Easter Sunday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas Day.

II. Office Space:

For the annual sum of \$2,832, CMHS agrees to provide City with office space as follows:

1. Office space of approximately 60 square feet.
2. City shall provide all necessary office supplies for Animal Control employees.
3. CMHS shall provide, at its expense, electric, gas, water, and sewer service.

III. Kennel Facilities for Boarding Impounded Animals:

For the annual sum of \$94,654 CMHS agrees to provide to City first priority access to not fewer than thirty (30) animal confinement cages.

1. The cages shall be of a design, construction, location and access acceptable to City's Health Officer. The cages provided by CMHS to City during the last calendar year shall

be deemed acceptable unless the City Health Officer shall notify CMHS to the contrary. Specifically:

- a. animal runs for the exercise of confined animals;
 - b. necessary housekeeping and sanitation services to provide a safe and sanitary environment for impounded animals, including daily cleaning and sanitation, as required, of the cages and runs;
 - c. external parasite control and other sanitary services which may be mutually agreed upon between the parties.
2. CMHS shall provide adequate and nourishing animal food, meeting the specifications of the National Research Council, Washington, D.C., or equivalent specifications.
 3. CMHS specifically agrees to provide the City, at all times, with confinement cages for all small animals. The exception to this requirement shall be common, domestic livestock, impounded by the City.
 4. The intention of this agreement is that such spaces required by the City will be provided as individual accommodations and, unless multiple animal house is necessary for animal well being, no more than one animal impounded by the City shall be confined to any one cage.
 5. Provided, that the "first priority" right of the City should not preclude use of cages or other facilities by CMHS when not needed by City.
 6. This section shall apply only to animals impounded by Animal Control Officers within the corporate limits of the City of Columbia and Boone County.

IV. Veterinary Medical Services:

- A. CMHS will provide veterinary services between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, with the exception of holidays. City will reimburse CMHS \$5,998 for veterinary services. These professional services shall consist of:
 1. Examination and treatment of individual animals as requested by Animal Control.
 2. Euthanasia as requested by Animal Control, and approved by the CMHS veterinarian, for animals in Animal Control's care and custody.
 3. Assistance in Animal Control cruelty cases.
 4. In-court testimony where subpoenaed by the City Attorney or a Prosecuting Attorney.

- B. CMHS will provide protection of animal health and the prevention of the spread of disease by providing Bordetella vaccination for all animals being housed, pursuant to this contract, by CMHS on behalf of AC. City will reimburse CMHS \$5,546 for this veterinary prevention of this highly communicable disease.
- C. CMHS will provide emergency veterinary services outside of regular operating hours, pending veterinary staff availability, for the purpose of providing emergency care for injured dogs and cats.

V. Sterilization Voucher Program:

For the annual sum of \$11,250 CMHS will provide one hundred and fifty (150) sterilization vouchers to Animal control to distribute to owners of dogs and cats in the City of Columbia and Boone County.

1. The vouchers will subsidize the cost of sterilization surgery at no charge to the owner.
2. Animal Control will complete the voucher with required information.
3. CMHS will remit used vouchers to Animal Control so that they may evaluate the effectiveness of the program.

VI. Boone County Program:

CMHS agrees that all services and privileges herein granted to the City will also be provided in support of the Boone County animal Control Program with the understanding that cages used for animals impounded through the Boone County program shall be counted as part of the thirty (30) cages allocated above for City use.

VII. ACFA License Fee:

CMHS agrees to remain licensed and pay all associated fees under the HS under the Animal Care and Facilities Act (ACFA) and with no cost to the City.

VIII. Payment for Services and Term of Agreement:


This agreement for support services shall be in effect for the period January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2012. For the services provided under this contract, the City will pay to CMHS the annual sum of \$120,280. The total amount due under this contract may be paid upon execution of the contract in the equivalent of 12 monthly installments of \$10,023.

Binding Effect:

This agreement shall be executed, in duplicate, by properly authorized officers of CMHS and City and shall be binding on CMHS and City.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

A resolution authorizing the City Manager to sign the 2012 Contract for Services between the City of Columbia and Central Missouri Humane Society (CMHS) in the amount of \$120,280.

DISCUSSION:

This is an annual contract. Highlights of the 2012 contract are as follows:

Office Space - \$2,832

(60 square feet for processing animals picked up by Animal Control Officers and 24 hour/day access to the CMHS facility)

Kennel Facilities for Impounded Animals - \$94,654

Veterinary Medical Services - \$5,998

Bordatella Vaccination - \$5,546

Sterilization Voucher Program - \$11,250

FISCAL IMPACT:

Funding for this agreement was anticipated during the budget process.
