Use of Hotel/Motel Tax Revenue for Economic Development

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The City Manager's budget proposes to use \$50,000 in hotel tax revenue to partially fund the City's contribution to Regional Economic Development, Inc. (REDI). Staff has prepared an amendment to Chapter 26 that would add "economic development" as an allowed use for hotel tax revenue.

DISCUSSION:

The City Manager's budget proposes to begin a shift in how the City funds its contribution to REDI. The proposed budget would spend \$50,000 of new growth in the hotel tax to replace \$25,000 of General Fund revenue.

Currently, the hotel gross receipts license tax revenue is placed in the convention and tourism fund and can only be spent to promote conventions and tourism. An amendment to the ordinance has been prepared that would authorize the expenditure of hotel tax revenue to promote economic development.

FISCAL IMPACT:

If the ordinance is amended and the City Manager's budget proposal is followed, \$50,000 of the tourism fund would be used to partially fund REDI replacing \$25,000 of General Fund revenue.
