

What is CARP?

CARP (Columbia Aquatic Restoration Project) is a volunteer program designed to support the Columbia Parks & Recreation Department in implementing an aquatic plant and shoreline management plan. The goal of this project is to train volunteers to assist in aquatic park management and maintenance in the growing number of park ponds, streams, retention basin, rain gardens and lakes.

CARP volunteers agree to:

- Attend the three CARP classes.
- Assist the city horticulturalist in organized projects, donating at least 18 hours of your time.
- Use standard hand tools and equipment and perform manual labor. You must be able to bend, stoop, dig, reach and lift.
- Work outdoors and in and around water, often in varied weather conditions.
- Work cooperatively with City staff, other volunteers and the general public.

Why Volunteer?

By participating in CARP, you will learn about lake and pond ecology. You will be volunteering to improve water bodies in our parks to be enjoyed for years to come.

Training subjects include:

- Aquatic Plants
- Pond Ecology
- Storm Water Management
- Rain Gardens

In addition to class instruction you receive field training and experience to reinforce what you have learned. After the course you will be invited to participate in projects designed by the city horticulturalist to put your new-gained knowledge into action, which improves water bodies in our city parks.
